STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

1	Absence from School.	Written Warning, Counselling and signing of bond, Manual work for persistence, One-week internal suspension.
2	Absenteeism from School functions.	Written Warning, Counselling and signing of bond, Manual work.
3	Breaking Bounds.	Deboardinazation, Two-week internal suspension, External suspension not more than 3 weeks, Withdrawal.
4	Bringing unprescribed items to school (e.g., mobile phones, electronics).	Seizure of item. Additional sanctions: Written Warning, Manual work.
5	Contravening general visiting regulations.	Written Warning, Counselling.
6	Defacing school wall.	Manual work (to clean/repair the wall), Payment of twice the cost of repair, Written Warning.
7	Drug abuse (Alcohol, cigarettes, Indian hemp/wee).	Items confiscated, reported to the police. Additional sanctions: Dismissal, Withdrawal.
8	Examination malpractices.	Cancellation of examination paper, Dismissal, Withdrawal.
9	Extortion / Forgery / Stealing.	Withdrawal, Dismissal, reported to the police.
10	Failure to make 60% attendance in a semester without permission.	Withdrawn (with Board approval) or made to repeat the class.
11	Failure to participate in academic activity (e.g., classwork, homework).	Counselling, Demotion in position, Two-week internal suspension, Withdrawal.
12	Failure to perform House duties.	Manual work, Written Warning.

13	Failure to report on re-opening day without a tangible excuse.	Manual work, Written Warning, One-week internal suspension.
14	Failure to write an examination without good reason / Persistent refusal.	Withdrawn after appropriate investigation and intervention.
15	Flouting authority of Prefect and Members of Staff.	Written Warning, Openly read written apology, Counselling and signing of bond, Manual work.
16	Flouting the authority of the Head of School.	Demotion in position (if a prefect), Two-week internal suspension, External suspension, Deboardinazation, Withdrawal.
17	Gaming/Gambling.	Dismissed.
18	Girls who abort their pregnancy.	Withdrawn.
19	Hiding in the dormitory.	Deboardinazation, Two-week internal suspension, External suspension.
20	Improper behaviour outside the school in school uniform.	Written Warning, Openly read written apology, Counselling and signing of bond, Manual work.
21	Improper dressing (e.g., unprescribed attire, alterations to uniform).	Unprescribed dresses shall be confiscated. Additional sanctions: Written Warning, Manual work.
22	Improper dressing.	Deboardinazation, Two-week internal suspension, Demotion in position.
23	Incitement to Riot / Rioting / Demonstration.	Specific Sanctions: Ring leaders dismissed; Participants suspended; Parents to pay twice the cost of damages.
24	Loitering at odd times and at odd places.	Written Warning, Counselling, Manual work.
25	Major Sexual misconduct (Homosexuality, rape, etc.).	Withdrawn from the school.

26	Minor Sexual misconduct.	Counselling and signing of bond, Written Warning, One-week internal suspension with manual work.
27	Negligence of duty / Misuse of power by Prefects.	Written Warning, Counselling, Demotion in position.
28	Overstaying mid-term holidays / public holidays / exeats.	Manual work, Written Warning, One-week internal suspension.
29	Physical and Psychological Violence (e.g., fighting, assault).	Withdrawal from the school. May also be reported to the police.
30	Practicing Occultism.	Withdrawal, Dismissal.
31	Refusal to attend classes.	Counselling and signing of bond, Written Warning, One-week internal suspension with manual work for persistence.
32	Sending food to the classroom / dormitory or eating there.	Written Warning, Manual work (e.g., cleaning the area), Counselling.
33	Travelling outside school / town without permission.	Written Warning, Counselling and signing of bond, One-week internal suspension.
34	Wearing ornaments (chains, bangles, etc.).	Suspended in addition to confiscation for good.
35	Wilful damage to school property.	Payment of twice the prevailing price in addition to other punishments like Manual work, Suspension, or Withdrawal.

Please be aware that while the school's Code of Conduct is guided by the official framework from the **Ghana Education Service (GES) Council**, every disciplinary case is unique.

In line with the GES guidelines, the school's **Disciplinary Committee** will **judge each case** on its own merit. The school has the **authority to adjust sanctions** making them **more or less severe** as **deemed appropriate** to ensure the outcome is **fair** and **constructive**.
